



KKFU is able to scale regenerative cocoa farming systems amongst its members




#### **Guiding Question:**

 Co-create a collaborative solution with relevant partners in Ghana.










System Map


- Over 100 enablers

Leverage Points

- 17 main leverage points, of which two are cross-loop leverage points
- Some are possible to pursue within the cocreation phase, some are out of reach



# Additional Relevant Findings

- **1**
- ▶ There are more actors and interested\* organisations present in Ghana than we thought. Could be a good moment to develop a "regenerative cocoa community of practice"
- ► There was a lot of uncertainty / disagreement regarding costs and benefits. Developing the business case with economic modelling a must to convince others and reach scale
- ▶ Many issues that are difficult to solve already in "conventional" sustainability programs, become more complicated with the dynamic agroforestry approach, which requires more efforts at all levels
- ▶ Big advantage of regenerative practices and the dynamic agroforestry model in specific: they tackle various problems the farmers are facing at once. There is therefore a chance, that the push for scale could come from the target group itself

<sup>\*</sup>Interest does not necessarily mean a shared vision! A common vision would have to be elaborated in the community. A more holistic view on farms is required from everyone.
