

Public-Private Partnerships – for more sustainability in the cocoa sector

Since the launch of the Swiss Platform for Sustainable Cocoa (SWISSCO), the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO) – being a founding member of SWISCCO – has provided a co-financing facility. It aims at leveraging private sector investments and promoting public-private and cross-sectoral partnerships to promote sustainability in the cocoa value chain.

As part of this strategy, in a first project cycle from 2018 to 2022, SECO provided CHF 6.5 million for the implementation of 14 innovative value chain projects that reached nearly 100'000 cocoa farmers. For the years 2023 to 2026, SECO provides a total amount of CHF 13 million for projects clustered around the following three core themes: Sustainable Sourcing Landscapes, Innovative Value Chain Projects, and Peer Learning & Collaboration.
